FINANCIAL AID

Students who are interested in applying for financial aid for the 2010-2011 academic year should have a completed financial aid application on file at Urban College. The deadline for priority consideration is August 3, 2010. Federal Pell Grants and Supplemental Education Opportunity Grants (SEOG) fund part-time and full-time students. The Mass Grant funds full-time students and Mass Part-time Grants fund part-time students. These grants do not have to be repaid. Applicants will need their 2009 Federal income tax returns, a high school diploma or GED Certificate as well as enrollment in Urban College of Boston's Degree or Certificate programs. Fall 2010 Courses Offer Many Choices

The Urban College of Boston is pleased to announce the creation of a new certificate program: **Health, Nutrition and Food Safety**. Students who successfully complete the curriculum will be eligible for employment in a variety of food service establishments, including child care centers, schools, restaurants, hotels, hospitals and other settings, working directly under a chef or on a team in a larger organization.

This semester's course offerings provide Urban College students with a wide range of options. Each of the College's programs—Early Childhood Education, General Studies and Human Services Administration—has a selection of courses that meet the needs of students whether they are beginning college or have advanced beyond the certificate stage. We are also offering a number of these courses on Saturdays.

The College offers ESOL writing courses for beginning and intermediate skill levels as well as College Writing I and II. The English curriculum is designed to aid the UCB student, whether English is their first language or not, to become proficient in their writing skills.

Many of the Early Childhood Education courses are offered in Spanish, Cantonese, and Mandarin, as well as English. This enables UCB students to complete licensing requirements for the Department of Early Education and Care in classroom and administrative categories while progressing toward their certificate, CDA, and/or degree. In addition to the Early Childhood Education core courses, this semester the department is also offering Infant-Toddler Curriculum, and Early Childhood Administration in English as well as Spanish; Cultural Aspects of Families & Children in Spanish and Chinese; and Early Intervention. In addition, the Fall semester includes two new courses: Leadership in Early Education and Care and Critical Thinking: Reading and Writing.

This fall we are offering two courses that are geared toward students who are planning on transferring to a four year college. They are American History since 1865 and Contemporary Literature. Either course will satisfy the Humanities requirement for degree candidates. Since CLEP will only be accepted as an elective, these courses will help all students fulfill the Humanities requirements. Additionally, we have added Child Welfare and Family Law, a course which will inform students from all programs about laws concerning child protection, custody, visitation and many other topics. All courses in the Health, Nutrition and Food Safety certificate program are available.

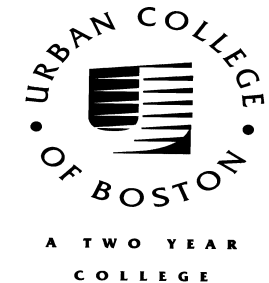
The Learning Resource Center (LRC) and the Office of Academic Support Services (OASS) are available to UCB students at no additional cost. In the LRC, tutors are available to help students organize papers, review written and oral assignments, and offer assistance with the computer. Students may work independently, engage in research on the Web or join with others to review course materials. Students can also request one-on-one tutoring sessions, offered by appointment only. The OASS will assist the student in developing an academic plan for success. This may be developing study skills, learning-style assessment, writing assessment and time management.

STUDENT SERVICES

UCB offers many services designed to support student effort, help overcome problems interfering with student progress, and be a referral source to community organizations.

Students are encouraged to utilize the personal, academic, and professional counseling resources of Student Services. Strict confidentiality is maintained at all times. In addition, Student Services sponsors student workshops and career guidance, a continuous process that includes academic and professional assessment at entry to UCB, career-related course work, required Professional Development seminars, and internships and field work. The UCB newsletter provides information to the UCB community.

At registration, students are designated an academic advisor. The student and advisor meet regularly to review and discuss the student's goals. The advisor recommends course selection and sequence and remains a key source of guidance. Each student also has access to staff assisting with matters of financial aid, internships, personal counseling, and referrals to other organizations. Through the support offered at the Urban College of Boston, students learn strategies and techniques necessary to secure professional, personal, and educational success.

Methods of Payment

ABCD Employees

ABCD employees who wish to use the Payroll Deduction Plan must have a minimum payment of 10% of the total tuition and fees deducted weekly from their paycheck.

Returned Checks

A \$25.00 charge will be added to any check returned by the bank to the Urban College of Boston.

Refund Policy

Students who officially withdraw from classes taught by UCB faculty in accordance with published withdrawal procedures may obtain refunds of tuition as follows:

Withdrawal before the first class	100%
Withdrawal before the second class	75%
Withdrawal before the third class	50%
Withdrawal before the fourth class	25%
Withdrawal after the fourth class	0%

All money will be refunded to the original source of funds. Fees are non-refundable.

Add/Drop Policy

Students who want to add or drop courses may do so prior to the second week of classes. See current catalog for more information.

In order to add or drop courses, students must consult with their academic advisor and bring a signed form to the Enrollment Services Office. Add/Drops will not be permitted after the second class of the semester.
